

## Central Mines Trail

This fire trail is part of the Mullion SCA and is located on the left hand side of Ophir Road about 2 kilometres beyond Third Crossing. The walk is gentle and takes around 20 minutes to reach the river crossing at the bottom of the hill. A side branch about 500 metres down the hill goes to a tumbling waterfall which is spectacular after good rain.
